## Safety, Police, Fire, Protective Inspections, Codes, EMA

Mayor's Report – Mayor was not present.

Police Report – Brad Wilson gave the following updates as provided by Chief James Bodine:

Santa Claus Event – The Chief has been in contact with Ryan Rumsey and they would like to hold the Santa Claus Parade on December 11<sup>th</sup> beginning at 5pm. The parade route will begin at the Rock L. Butler Middle School and travel down Nichols Street to Main, where it will turn and go against the flow of traffic down the Penn Wells Side of the boulevard. This will allow the parade to disburse once it gets to the Queen Street intersection of Main Street. They have agreed to have individuals pass out candy along the parade route instead of tossing candy from moving vehicles, this will help with the safety concerns since it will most likely be getting dark around the time of the parade. Ryan is to provide a blanket insurance liability letter to the Borough and once the event is approved by Council a letter of support will need to be provided for his Penn Dot Permit submission. It is expected to only take a few weeks to get the permit back.

Bicycles on Main Street – Complaints have been received about bicycles on the sidewalks on Main Street. The ordinance regarding bicycles needs to be updated to reflect that bicycles cannot be ridden on Main Street between Central and East Avenue. If the Ordinance is updated then violators can be charged with an Ordinance Violation instead of a Traffic Violation which will cost them less in fees. Signs need to be placed at every intersection once the ordinance is updated. There are signs available that fit with the historic feel of Main Street.

Councilor West made a motion to approve the request for the Santa Claus Parade to be held on December 11<sup>th</sup> at 5 pm contingent upon the receipt of proof of insurance. The motion was seconded by Councilor Hart and carried.

## Public Works, Solid Waste, Highways, Parking, Water, Sewer

Sewer lining completion of Main St in progress – estimated 3-4 days to complete -work will be completed during the night starting at 7PM

Replacement fleet truck is ordered and awaiting upgrades and delivery
