A motion was made by Councilor Connelly to approve the King Street Bridge increase in Borough Share of construction by \$7,900. The motion was seconded by Councilor Sticklin and carried unanimously. Construction costs on the bridge increased from \$1,257,000 to \$1,415,400.

Councilor Wood made a motion to approve the borough as a partnering organization with the Source Water Protection Coalition and Tioga County Conservation District for a Media Outreach grant. Councilor Sticklin seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

The Riberolle Street Bridge is closed due to structural failure. We are working on a repair that will allow us to reopen this bridge for passenger vehicles only. The Street Committee meets Thursday at 2:00 p.m. to discuss this.

PennDOT advised Manager Strausser that the milling and overlay of Route 6 from the Diner to near Pierce Street will begin on July 7th.

Parks & Recreation, Trees, Beautification, Senior Center

Councilor Sticklin made a motion to approve the May 26th Memorial Day Parade requested by the American Legion Post 84 and the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) Post 4907. The motion was seconded by Councilor Scharf and carried unanimously.
