NEW BUSINESS- Craig Musser asked Council to make a contribution toward the sandblasting of the Jet A and 100 load tanks. Delmar and the Borough are both being asked to contribute toward the total cost of \$6800.00. The council tabled this matter until the Administration Committee could look it over more thoroughly. They will have an answer at the next meeting.

Tussey Moser Funeral Home 139 Main Street-Siding replacement; HARB recommends approval. Councilor Sticklin made a motion to approve the modification and repair, Councilor Wood seconded, and it passed.

Adopt Ordinance #673 providing for the reimbursement for expenses and services for fire, police, public works and other public safety services for extraordinary expenses. Councilor Sticklin made a motion to adopt the ordinance, Councilor Wood seconded, and it passed.

Motion to approve Change order # 3 to Black Bear Construction for additional remodeling in the police office in the amount of \$10,650.00. This will be taken from Police LST account \$5,650 and General Rainy Day Fund \$5,000.00. Councilor Bryant made a motion to approve, Councilor Scharf seconded, and it passed.

The Deane Center's request for partial tax exemption was denied by the County Tax Assessment Board.

Motion to accept UGI Gas price of \$6.06 per dth for 12 months from September 1, 2013 to August 31, 2014. We currently are at \$5.93. Councilor Sticklin made a motion to accept the quote, Councilor Wheeler seconded, and it passed.

Motion to approve Act 13 fund uses. Councilor Wood made a motion to approve the uses, Councilor Scharf seconded, and it passed.

The 2013 street program has started and will be completed by August 23rd. This consists of Stickley Street and Nichols Street from Route 6 to school entrance.

Traffic Signals update- The camera at Charleston Street and the camera at Central Avenue were not functioning properly. They are under warranty and will be replaced. Timing was off at Grant St. and East Avenue. Also, the time on the master control was off by one hour. It needs to be manually adjusted for daylight savings time.

As there were many complaints about the traffic signal timing and many concerns voiced about pedestrian safety, the Borough Manager will obtain PennDOT's permit modification procedure in writing.
