## MINUTES

FALL & WINTER WATERING: They did the watering of trees as planted. There is a thirty gallon gator bag on the Christmas tree on the Green that is being filled once a day. Have 15 gallon gator bags for the trees on Main Street. Will stop watering once the weather gets too cold.

STUMP REMOVAL: Will look at the program in the spring of each year.

PERMITS: A permit was entered into record for the fall planting of trees.

Peter Herres and Robert McCarthy met with Natalie from The Wellsboro Gazette and an article was put into last week's paper on what would be happening on West Ave.

SPRING PLANTING PLAN: They will identify potential sites and make up a list.
